Community Group Agenda

One: Fellowship

(The goal of this time is to encourage authentic relationships.)

 If you need a question to help your conversations go a little deeper, ask, "Have you thought about doing a Bible Study this summer?"

Two: Worship/Prayer & Care

(The goal of this time is to make sure we take the time to pray.)

- If your group worships in song spend this time singing or close your Community Group with worship:
 - Singing In The Victory
- Spend time this week in prayer praying Ephesians 4:11-16, "build each other up". Ask God to help NFCC "grow" and "build" one another up. Pray that you would not flinch from speaking hard truth to one another, but that you would do so in love. Pray that those who are on the fringes of church like would come to see the essential role they can play. Use Community Group time to build each other up.

Three: Application of the Word

(The goal of this time is to help you apply what God is saying to you through His Word in the sermon and daily devotionals.)

- Devotional: During last weeks daily readings we saw God's people rebel against God by abandoning Him (Judges 2:8-13), God's people are punished and given over to their enemies (Judges 2:14-15), and God's people are saved through God's chosen leader (Judges 2:16-19). What are some ways you can hold yourself and others accountable to listen to God's Word and obey in gratitude for your salvation?
- Sermon: Discuss Pastor Tracy's sermon:
 - What convicted you or stood out to you from the sermon? Was there anything the Holy Spirit was pressing on your heart to act on?
 - What did Pastor Tracy say was one of the main purposes of the prophets message to the people of God?
 - Read Joel 2:12-17 together.
 - How did God command the people to return to him? How does a person return to God with all his or her heart? How does a church return to God with all their heart?
 - Why does God want them to "rend" (tear) their hearts and not their garments? What does that mean? (see Deut. 30:6)
 - How does Joel describe God in verse 13? It's easy to approach a
 God who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, abounding in
 steadfast love, and relenting over disaster. We are comfortable with
 this description of God. But do we believe that God will judge all
 who do not worship Him alone? Do we approach God as a God of
 judgment and wrath?

- Is God seeking the repentance of individuals only? What does Joel call the whole congregation to do together?
- How does the Lord respond to the people? (See Joel 2:18-19)
- How have you seen God's grace, mercy, patience, and steadfast love toward you in the past when you repented before God of a particular sin that entangled you?

Four: Ministry & Mission

(The goal of this time is to ensure the group plans and participates in ministry and mission opportunities coordinated by the church.)

Camp In The City is fast approaching. Every year our church provides support for the Pine Cove staff as they work hard throughout the week to provide and epic camp experience for our kids. We have 40 staffers from Pine Cove and 180 kids coming to this years camp! One way the church can support Camp In The City is by praying for the staffers and the kids attending the camp. Pray the Lord's Glory will be shown and kids will come to know the love of Jesus.

Family Discipleship

FAMILY ACTIVITY: Encourage your kids to invite friends to church. Arrange to transport those friends to church or invite their parents to come too!

BABIES & TODDLERS

- God helps us obey Him.
- God's people asked God to save them.
- God used Deborah and Barak to help His people.

KIDS

- Why does God use people in His plans?
- How can we know His plans are good?
- Why happens when people reject God and live however they want?

PRESCHOOL

- Why do you think Barak wanted Deborah to come with him?
- How do we know God won the battle for Israel and not themselves?
- What are some ways we have seen God work for His glory and the good of our family?

STUDENTS

 In verses 14-16, what did Deborah do for Barak? How can this be a powerful weapon used in the service of others?

Daily Reading Plan

Select a Time:

What time will you set apart for your time in God's Word?

Select a Place:

Where will you spend time in God's Word?

Follow the Plan:

Follow the next steps are you open God's Word.

Prepare Your Heart:

The Bible says in Psalm 46:10, "Be still, and know that I am God." Spend the next few moments to focus you heart and mind on God. You might pray, "Lord, cleanse my heart and calm my mind so you can speak to me through your Scriptures. Make my mind alert and my soul active during this time."

Some might want to journal what God says to you and what He tells you to do.

Read God's Word:

Open God's Word to the text for the day. Read through the text, meditate on it, and ask:

- Is there a command to obey?
- Is there a promise to claim?
- Is there a sin to avoid?
- Is there a truth to carry with me?
- How does this passage teach me to love?
 To live more like Christ?

Pray:

Pray through the passage. Pray through the questions you asked yourself. Be honest with God, asking him to change your heart and your life based on the time you spent in God's Word.
